

The JD is more than a degree. It's a lifelong tool that helps you navigate legal, business, and ethical challenges affecting nearly every aspect of 21st century life.

- + Earn between a **50% and 100% scholarship**
- + Receive a **\$12,000 summer stipend** the summer after your first year
- + **Study for a semester** at O.P. Jindal Global University, or one of our other international partner schools during your second or third year
- + Work the summer after your first year as a global **intern with a prestigious law firm, NGO, or multinational company**
- + **Serve as a research assistant with Professor Jay Krishnan**, conducting research on law and the legal profession in India, and receiving up to \$3,000 for your work
- + Find support from faculty (affiliated with the Center on the Global Legal Profession), senior students, or an alumni mentor as part of our mentorship program
